DISPENSING MEDICATION AND PRESCRIPTIONS

We have a helpful blog on our website about dispensing medication and prescriptions breaking down the legal requirements for new prescriptions, and ongoing dispensing of medication.

In order to prescribe ongoing medication in the form of prescriptions the law is again very clear. Prescriptions are only valid for 28 days from the date of signing and must be redeemed within 6 months. After this period a prescription is no longer valid. Therefore any continued dispensing after this date requires the animal to be seen for POM-V medication.

All horses require a physical examination before any medication is dispensed. Ongoing medication requires us to see an animal every 6 months in order to continue dispensing the medication. This means we have to see the animal for the condition the medication is being dispensed for.
