UK vaccination-preventable diseases:

- TETANUS - 10% survival unvaccinated vs. near 100% vaccinated
- FLU - Virus travels 5km; outbreaks affect 100s of horses
- STRANGLES - 600+ UK outbreaks/year; 80% infection rate
- EHV - 80-90% of horses carry dormant virus
