EHV AMNESTY

When did you last vaccinate your horse against the potentially fatal Equine Herpes Virus (EHV)? If it hasn't been within the last 24 months you could be eligible for our EHV Amnesty.

EHV is highly contagious and spreads easily from horse to horse through nasal secretions. Every inhalation is a risk to your horse. However, vaccination can help to reduce the spread of disease.

If you start the EHV vaccine course and get the first and second vaccination done by the 31st July 2026, you can get the third one FREE!* If you're interested in taking part and protecting your horse against EHV, please contact the practice for more information (01442 851921)

EHV VACCINE COURSE

- 1st vaccination
- 2nd vaccination- 4-6 weeks after 1st vaccine
- Boosters - 6 monthly from date of 2nd vaccine, then every 6 months ongoing

VACCINE COST

The cost of each EHV vaccine is £48.16 (excl visit fee).

WHAT IS EQUINE HERPES VIRUS?

The two most significant types of EHV are: Equine Herpes Virus 1 (EHV-1) and Equine Herpes Virus 4 (EHV-4) and they are often collectively referred to as Equine Herpes Virus (EHV).

EHV-4: Primarily causes respiratory disease, EHV-1: Causes respiratory disease, abortion in pregnant mares, and devastating neurological disease. Whilst in most cases horses will make a good recovery from EHV respiratory disease, the prognosis is variable for those with EHV neurological disease.

EHV symptoms are very variable and often go unnoticed. Young horses often show very pronounced flu-like symptoms, but this isn't as prominent in older horses. As with many viral infections, an increase in body temperature over 38.5C is often the first cause for concern.
